1. Grocery Bag Distribution in Navi Mumbai

The Jubilee Malayalam Church, Sanpada Pastorate distributed grocery bags consisting of Rice (5 Kg), Atta (5 Kg), Sugar (1 Kg), Tur dal (1.Kg), Mysore dal (1.Kg), Poha (1 Kg), Raya (1 Kg) Cooking Oil (1 lit), Tea





(100 gm), Bath soap (2 Nos), Chilly Powder (100 Gm) and Salt (1 Pkt), each bag costs Rs. 800.

We distributed grocery bags at Sector 5,8,&9 Nerul, Sector- 8 CBD Belapur, Navi Mumbai. The recipients were mostly slum dwellers.

2. Grocery Bag Distribution at Akhloli, Palghar

The church provided funding for the grocery distribution at Akhloli Mission, among our believers. Our MDMM Coordinator Rev. Vasudeo Deshmukh Pathiri Saheb and the local missionary Mr. Shyam Gorath helped us for the purchase and supply. We are proud of the work MDMM has been doing at Akhloli under the leadership of Rev. Deshmukh and Mr. Shyam.

3. Drinking Water for Police Officials

The church provided 1000 bottles of drinking water to the Police Officials from Vashi Tollbooth to

duty to lessen their burden and help them in their hour of distress, the following solidarity work had been done so far.

Kharghar Tollbooth and at Sanpada, Nerul, CBD Belapur Police Stations. It was a relief for the officers who were controlling the Traffic for long hours in the hot and humid weather and doing extra hour effort in the lockdown time.

The Panvel Worship Centre of the Jubilee Malayalam Church distributed grocery bag in a slum near Panvel Railway Station. Along with that two month ration of Grocery and clothes were given to the inmates of Bless Home- an HIV infected children home near Panvel. We are happy that our worship centre shows its progress.

Conclusion

The Sanpada Pastorate shared her resource with the Bombay Diocesan Council, Shalom Mission and with the Bless Home, Panvel. The pastorate and the worship centre altogether spend 4 Lakh rupees so far, for this charity work. Shri. Amit Somanath Sanap, Panvel Tahasildar, and Mr. D. S Chabekswar, the Deputy Commissioner of Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation (NMMC) helped us to find out the needy people. The Deputy Commissioner of NMMC personally prepared the list of people and hand it over to us, therefore we were able to make sure that our help reaches in the appropriate hands. All works that the Jubilee Malayalam Church has done is measured to be the witness of the Church of North India, Let us keep our Motto, Unity-Witness-Service firm and clear now and always. The mission continues. God bless our diocese and our church.

23rd June 2020 - A day at Prem Jyothi Community Hospital, Jharkhand

My day began with a 6 am call from hospital.



A lady in a pitiable condition

A pregnant lady with obstructed labour was at our hospital after going to a hospital in Ranga and then to the District Hospital, Sahibganj. Referred to us from a district hospital? And in what a pitiable condition! A pint of blood attached to the patient & half transfused! with the IV cannula stuck out & just about stuck to the skin with the micropore. She was pale, constriction ring in the abdomen, probably ruptured uterus, baby dead \otimes & the lady almost passing out. We started the emergency treatment and asked them to take her to a bigger hospital for the caesarean due to lack of blood bank here.

They insisted that we do the surgery here. How difficult to explain almost certain loss of her life, if operated upon without a blood bank. A sigh of relief as they arranged to take her back to another hospital in Sahibganj with blood bank. Praying that she gets the correct treatment at the earliest.

Marandi boy discharged - His story

This tribal baby born was born at home. He did not cry after birth and had multiple seizures and was bought

to the hospital a day later with seizures vomiting and an extremely low glucose level. He was on oxygen for 3 days at high pressure and under close monitoring by staff. He used to stop breathing. Staff immediately helped resume breathing through stimulation and with medicines. This indicated injury to brain. Tried some new not so usually used medicines after discussing with a paediatrician to get the boy breathing and prayed. Finally, after 3 days, he was breathing without any stimulation. Tapered drugs and oxygen slowly and discharged him today. He is feeding well, active and only on one drug for seizures. Discharged after 6 days in our nursery. Praise the Lord.



Discharge of the eclampsia lady who came altered - Her story

She was brought in with seizures, altered sensorium, unconscious and intermittently agitated. BP at 200/110, damaged kidney, in labour, and a dead baby! Gave drugs and requested her to be taken to a hospital with gynaecologist. These poor people couldn't go anywhere. With medicines and within 4 hours of admission she delivered a dead baby. She was still unconscious, BP remained uncontrolled despite being on 2 medicines and she was still agitated and semiconscious 48 into maximal treatment. Planned to send



her for brain CT scan if she didn't improve but decided to wait for 2 more days & prayed. Miraculously the very next day she was sitting up, not talking, but conscious and aware of surrounding. Slowly, she improved and didn't need a CT scan which is far away. Praise God, today she went home walking.

Out Patients

A busy day with a variety of ailments - Diabetes, High Blood Pressure, Chronic liver disease, Antenatal women, otitis externa, cavity of tooth & malaria (first case this season.....surge going to happen soon I guess), scalp abscess, tb pleural effusion, coccygeal fracture, leg ulcer (undiagnosed yet), a kid with tongue tie etc.

Labour Room in the meanwhile.

Labour room had 3 patients. One lady was post-dated and had to be posted for caesarean due to foetal heart deceleration. The mother and the baby were fine. Completed the surgery by 5pm and had lunch. Prepared a bullseve. The day has just begun.

A lady with situs inversus (highlight of the day)

This tribal lady had 5 deliveries at home. She is a community health worker with the Jharkhand Government. She came complaining of some weird abdomen pain. To rule out stones we asked her to get an ultrasound. Guess what? She has a rare anomaly called situs inversus, where all her

abdominal organs are other way around - right to left. Then checked her heart, that too was on the other side (right)!!. Ruled out any cardiac anomalies by echo. She did have some gall stones, now fine. She went home as if nothing was wrong.



The second lady in labour room too had to be posted for caesarean at 10:45pm. The third lady had a normal delivery while the caesarean was in process.

An accident case

Soon after the caesarean came a young man who was a pavilion rider on a bike, had an accident and came complaining of neck pain. Thankfully, since he had a

helmet on, there was no head injury but suffered cervical spine fracture. Advised him to get a collar and orthopaedic opinion. Finally retired for the day by 1:30 am. Only 2 phone calls during the night from the hospital, for inpatients.



This hospital was started in December 1996 as a unique partnership between three major Indian mission agencies: the Friends Missionary Prayer Band (FMPB), the Evangelical Fellowship of India Commission on Relief (EFICOR), and the Emmanuel Hospital Association (EHA) to address the health needs of the Malto tribals - a diminishing tribal group, in the north-eastern corner of Jharkhand. It focused mainly on their health needs, through a network of community health volunteers, peripheral clinics and a hospital. Emphasis was given on training and empowering the community to tackle health problems. Since 2011 the focus has broadened beyond health to address the social determinants of health.

I joined the hospital in April 2019 after finishing MBBS and currently the only doctor in the hospital. God is helping us (the hospital team) to cope with new situations everyday and saving lives far beyond our means and capabilities.


As we trust in the Lord with all our heart and render our service to the community, please pray for the hospital team and for divine intervention in our efforts to save lives and improve general well-being.

torch during power failure


