Message from the Presbyter

Dear Beloved- in- Christ,

“Greetings in the precious name of our Lord Jesus Christ”

“Rejoice in the Lord always”

The Motto for the year 2017 is mentioned above. ‘Rejoice’, the word has complex meanings. But it is somewhat clear in the spiritual realm; when we add the word rejoice to the Lord, that is, ‘rejoice in the lord’. Rejoice is the quality of joy. Paul himself was lying in prison with almost certain death awaiting him; the Philippians were setting out on the Christian way, and dark days, dangers and persecutions inevitably lay ahead, Paul is proclaiming that “Rejoice....I will say it again----Rejoice!”

Some have false notions about happiness. John Maxwell says, some of us suffer from **destination disease**. They think that when they arrive at a certain point, they’ll be happy: when they retire, take a trip to reach that goal. But we should realize that our happiest moments are along the way, not at the end of the trip. Isaiah says, “Morning by morning He wakens my ear to listen like one being taught.” (Isa. 50:4)

Others suffer from **somebody sickness**. “If I could just find somebody to make me happy”. No human being can bring lasting happiness to you! You’ve got to take responsibility for your own happiness. It’s through growing, even when it’s painful, that you find happiness. Paul says, “Let us...to on to maturity.” (Heb 6:1). Isaiah says that God has things to teach you every day. Still others suffer from **yesterday blues**. A woman wrote to a newspaper editor and said, “Your newspaper is not as good as it used to be. He wrote back, ‘It never has been!’ we like to crown the past with the halo and remember only the good times. David said, “This is the day the Lord hath made, let us rejoice and be glad in it.” (Psalm 118:24).

What does rejoice mean for us? Let us meditate and by Grace of God let us find out how meaningful is the word ‘rejoice’ in our faith journey.

God Can Bring Music Back into Your Lives!

We are stepping into a New Year. A New Year gives us yet another opportunity to look back as well as look forward. Looking back we have every reason to *thank* our Lord and looking forward we have every reason to *trust* Him.

Many are entering this New Year with a plethora of negatives-Economic decline financial crisis, uncertainty and fear of the future. Many believe that there is a 'Demon' hiding in the demonetization that the central government is currently pursuing. The debate for pros and cons is on and hopefully the dust will settle in a couple of month's time. Despite the negatives I believe that there is a reason for us to sing - the reason for the season - the person and work of Jesus Christ!

There are four songs which are part of the nativity narratives that we read in Gospel according to Luke:

- *Benedictus* : Zecharia's Song (Luke 1: 68-79)
- *Magnificat* : Song of Mary (Luke 1: 46-55)
- *Gloria in excelsis Deo* : Song by angels(Luke 2:14)
- *Nunc Dimmitis* : Simeon's song (Luke 2: 29-32)

What is instructive about these songs are they are sung by or sung to ordinary people. Secondly all these songs except that of Simeon are associated with the visitation by the angels. We don't see any VIPs there. All of them are VOPs- Very Ordinary People! An ordinary *priest* named Zachariah who was one among the 24000 priests waiting their turn to burn incense in the temple, an ordinary peasant *woman* Mary who was visited by angel Gabriel himself. Then the angels brings the good tidings of gladness and joy to a group who were less than ordinary in the first century cultural milieu- the *shepherds*. Finally an *old man* and devout Jew named Simeon whose antecedents we don't know also starts singing!

It is a big relief to know that God's extra-ordinary working happens in the ordinariness of life and that too with ordinary folks like you and me. See the universality of the message that is breaking the barriers of race, rank and sex and cutting across all strata of the society - priests and shepherds, women and men, people in the main stream and those who were marginalized, and making them all sing!

The first Christmas as we have been seeing is splashed with the natural and supernatural, splashed with singing of both earthly and heavenly beings. And indeed it is worship climax that we see in these songs. We can take a cue from the *Gloria in excelsis Deo*, the song that the heavenly choir sang to the shepherds: "*Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests.*"(Luke 2:14). In this song there is an *upward* as well as a *downward* dimension. Firstly what should go from earth to heaven is Glory to God- in other words *worship*. Secondly what comes from heaven to earth is *peace*. Peace is a by-product of worship! We have therefore twin responsibilities as we step into the New Year-to be true worshippers and authentic peacemakers. We should not miss the point that peace will not be ushered to everyone - only on whom his favour rests. This means that we need to pray for God's favour-his grace and mercy as we look forward into another exciting year.

This year we could commit ourselves to expend our time, talent and treasures to bring hope and help to a hurting world so that they can begin to sing along with us as they hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. Here's one quote on Christmas with which to start the New Year: *Infinite, and an infant. Eternal, and yet born of a woman. Almighty, and yet hanging on a woman's breast. Supporting a universe, and yet needing to be carried in his mother's arms. King of angels, and yet the reputed son of Joseph. Heir of all things, and yet the carpenter's despised son. Oh, the wonder of Christmas.* It is that wonder that should capture us and take us into the New Year. Without the wonder, life can be grinding and boring routines.

Viktor Frankl, one of the great psychiatrists of the twentieth century, survived the death camps of Nazi Germany. Frankl once told the story of a woman who called him in the middle of the night to calmly inform him she was about to commit suicide. Frankl kept her on the phone and talked her through her depression, giving her reason after reason to carry on living. Finally she promised she would not take her life, and she kept her word. When they later met, Frankl asked which reason had persuaded her to live. "None of them", she told him. Her answer was simple, it was Frankl's 'willingness to listen' to her in the middle of the night. A world in which there was someone ready to listen to another's pain seemed to her a world in which it was worthwhile to live. Often, it is not the brilliant argument that makes the difference. Sometimes the small act of listening is the greatest gift we can give to a hurting world. The world is waiting out there to receive the good news – the tidings of joy and peace.

For some of us our lives are broken primarily due to hurts in relationships. In the industry there is a term known as Beyond Economical Repairs (BER) which means that a particular piece of equipment is not worth the repairs and it is more economical to write it off. In God's economy however there are no BERs. The master's touch can mend all the broken chords and bring the music back into our lives! Often we remain as BER as we don't allow the Master to touch and transform us. Instead we become vulnerable to demonic influences as the evil one comes to destroy us. Jesus on the other hand has come to give us life and to give it abundantly. I have heard a cute little story that goes like this: One day some ink was accidentally spilled onto a beautiful and expensive handkerchief. The mess was observed by an artist who decided to make the best of the situation. So he drew a picture on the cloth and used the blotch of ink as part of the scenery. God is well-equipped to do that for us if we are prepared to let Him. The cost? A broken and a contrite heart. Nancy Spiegelberg wrote:

*Lord I crawled across the barrenness to you with my empty cup
Uncertain in asking any small drop of refreshment
If only I had known you better
I'd have come running with a bucket.*

In Switzerland there was a cathedral known as the 'mountain valley cathedral'. It is situated on a mountaintop. The church had an old pipe organ. Those days there were no PA system. The church music could be heard in the valley where people were working. They used to relish the music Sunday after Sunday. One day the pipe organ stopped functioning. They tried hard to repair it but couldn't succeed. So they replaced it with a small organ. But now the music reverberated only within the four walls of the church. The people in the valley came to know that the pipe organ is dead and that they won't be able to hear that melodious music again. One day an old man with a bag in his shoulder entered the church. He met the presbyter there and asked about the pipe organ. The presbyter told that it is dead and that they had unsuccessfully tried to repair it. The old man offered to repair it. Reluctantly the priest agreed. He saw that the old man was praying after repairing the organ. In few hours the music was back on the organ. The old man introduced himself. I am an old man now. 50 years back I was the one who installed this pipe organ in this church. I came to restore it. People plowing in the valley suddenly heard the music. They were overjoyed. God is our creator. He has 'installed' us here number of years

back. He can bring music back into our lives! The villagers in the valley had the music back in their lives too.

Yes God can bring the music back into our lives. This new year let us start singing. I would like to end this article with a quote which I love. It was a Christmas Eve address to the British common wealth delivered by King George VI. His closing quotation during those difficult days for Britain and the world following World War II. *"I said to the man at the gate of the year, "Give me a light that I may walk safely into the unknown". He said to me, "Go out into the darkness, and put your hand into the hand of God, and it shall be to you better than light, and safer than the known".*
