- 1) God has an impossible product with which to work (Eph:2:1-3). Paul painted a pathetic picture of human beings. Such is the world today without God. Sin has caused terrible plight. The person without Christ is dead. A person without Christ is dominated by the world. Looking at the present state of human beings could cause us to be pessimistic and to conclude that people are helpless. God, however, can take an unholy person and make a beautiful product. He is the master designer.
- 2) God has an incredible power with which to design (Eph:2:4-6). Paul described God's incredible ability to change human beings. God is merciful to humanity, and He desires to help. The mercy of God prompts the power of God to save us. The power of God changes human beings.
- 3) God has an indomitable purpose to accomplish (Eph:2:7-10). After God worked on the impossible product with his incredible power, He has a purpose for the finished product. All designer's wants to show their products. God's product can be seen in a changed life. God wants His believers to do good works. Good works follow a true relationship with the Lord. When we place our faith in Christ; good works are inevitable results. He is the Master Designer.

Decoding the essence of Christian Worship



What does Christian Worship mean to you?

Christian worship is often thought of as the music component of a church service. One pictures a group of select individuals wearing choral robes, positioned in front of the congregation, singing and leading the worship. If not in a traditional church setting, one then pictures a group of people singing songs to God, heads back, eyes closed, and hands raised in the air. The Oxford Dictionary defines worship as - "The feeling or expression of reverence and adoration for a deity; or great admiration and devotion shown towards a person or principle."

Personally for me, worship is a lifestyle response to God, and not just something done through music at church or elsewhere. Through this article, I would like to look upon why it is important to praise God, what exactly is its essence and how our worship of Him influences our Christian Life. My inspiration for the same can be attributed to an essay titled, 'A Word about Praising,' from CS Lewis' book titled, 'Reflections on the Psalms'. In the essay, CS Lewis states that it is not only permissible to enjoy God in worship, it was absolutely essential if one was to truly honour Him.

What does God desire from our Worship?

In our world that promotes selfie culture and propagates unabashed narcissism, we constantly witness episodes of self-centeredness. In the midst of this, we want to think that God is pre-eminently concerned with us, and not Himself. Or we may question why God who is altogether self-sufficient and cannot be served by human hands as if he needed anything (Acts 17:24–25; Romans 11:33–36), least of all glory, does then command our worship and praise of Him?

CS Lewis had such similar thoughts in the initial stages of his Christian journey. When he first began to draw near to God in belief, and even for some time afterward, he found the command to praise God a



stumbling block. The Psalms in particular were problematic for him. The obligation to honour Him and to attend church where His praises are sung, for Lewis, seemed contradictory for a God who also tells us that He needs nothing. He writes – "Gratitude to God, reverence to Him, obedience to Him, I thought I could understand; not this perpetual eulogy." So from a human perspective, this made God seem petty to him. Why did He demand this perpetual compliment, approval, and honour?

Part of Lewis's problem, as he himself confesses later in the essay, was that he did not see, "it is in the process of being worshiped that God communicates his presence to men." This is a key point wherein the command to praise is not just so that God can receive something, but is bound up in the very giving of God Himself. Lewis had thought about praise of God (and other things) in terms of compliment, approval, or honour. What had escaped his notice is the notion that "all enjoyment spontaneously overflows into praise."

"We not only spontaneously praise what we value but instinctively urge others to join in our praise, rhetorically asking, "Isn't she lovely? Wasn't it glorious? Don't you think that magnificent?"



The Book of Psalms was consequently unlocked and CS Lewis could now relate to the psalmist, who in enthusiastically imploring others to praise God was simply doing what all of us do when we enjoy and worship something. A profound insight here is that – praise completes our enjoyment – "I think we delight to praise what we enjoy because the praise not merely expresses but completes the enjoyment; it is its appointed consummation."

"It is not out of compliment that lovers keep on telling one another how beautiful they are; the delight is incomplete till it is expressed. It is frustrating to have discovered a new author and not to be able to tell anyone how good he is; to come suddenly at the turn of the road, upon some mountain valley of unexpected grandeur and then to have to keep silent because the people with you care for it no more than for a tin can in the ditch; to hear a good joke and find no one to share it with"

How will your Worship influence your Christian Life?

God does not command worship for himself because of neediness, but rather is providing us with a means toward our own great joy in Him. To glorify God by enjoying him forever is the ideal, and it is the eternal destination of all who are in Christ. That's the way God made us. We can't help but praise and rejoice in



what we most enjoy. The enjoyment itself is stunted and hindered if it is never expressed in joyful celebration. Lewis reminds us that our earthly worship is merely - tuning our instruments. Our most sacred rites, like the Jewish sacrifices in the Old Testament that preceded the sacrifice of Christ, are like the tuning and the promise, not the performance itself. Although tuning an instrument entails much duty but little delight, in the long run, the duty exists for the delight. Lewis writes - when we engage in "religious duties" we are like people "digging channels in a waterless land, in order that when at last the water comes, it may find them ready."

Correlating music and worship, Lewis mentions that the primary purpose of music coincides with the fundamental purpose of the universe – the glory of God. So for the "musically illiterate mass," among which he counted himself, a passion for the glory of God meant that one must be as ready to glorify Him by silence, when required, as by shouting. All natural agents glorify their Creator by continually revealing the powers He has granted them. Applied to music, he writes – "An excellently performed piece of music, as a natural

operation which reveals in a very high degree the peculiar powers give to man. will thus always glorify God whatever the intention of the performers may be." However, one should always take note of the fact that no degree of excellence alone can serve as a sufficient condition for glorifying the Lord. Our music will not please God in exactly the same way that it would please a music lover - "For all our offerings. whether of music martyrdom, are like the intrinsically worthless present of a child, which a

PREM JYOTHI COMMUNITY HOSPITAL, JHARKHAND

Baby of Mrs.Gulnesha was a 1.7 kg boy & 5 days old, when he was brought to the hospital on 7th of December 2019. After delivery at home, during the first 5 days, they observed that the baby was slowly losing consciousness and not feeding well. On arrival at hospital, the baby had seizures, was unconscious, looked completely yellow, had multiple episodes of apnea (stopping to breath for a while) and the chest had crepitation (a grating or crackling sound or sensation in lungs).

Not a case that a junior doctor like me would want to take up and treat, without the attention of a consultant.

As I spoke to the relatives, I realized that, for the past

3 days they had gone to many hospitals in the entire Sahibganj district and a neighboring district for getting treatment in vain. This baby was born to the family, 8 years after marriage!

It was particularly busy day at the hospital with the ventilator not available, in case the baby needed intubation. I informed the relatives about the unavailability of a pediatrician here, unavailability of a ventilator and the diagnosis with a very poor prognosis. They insisted that I admit the baby, whatever the outcome may be. I agreed. Discussed the boy with a pediatrician from Raxaul hospital over phone, and started managing the baby.

From then on everyday was hard work for medical team. Parents were expectantly waiting to hear a better prognosis.

The baby was on antibiotics, 3 medications to control seizures, phototherapy, and required ionotropes (medicines that change the force of your heart's contractions). With a bad chest, he continued to remain unconscious till day 7 of admission.





About Prem Jyoti Community Hospital

The Prem Jvoti community hospital was started in December 1996 as a unique partnership between three major Indian mission agencies:the Friends Missionary Praver Band (FMPB), the Evangelical Fellowship of India Commission on Relief (EFICOR), and the Emmanuel Hospital Association (EHA) to address the health needs of the Maltotribals - a diminishing tribal group. in the northeastern corner of Jharkhand. It focused mainly on their health needs, through a network of community health volunteers. peripheral clinics and a hospital. Emphasis was given on training and empowering the community to tackle health problems. Since 2011 the focus has broadened beyond health to address the social determinants of health.

Every day some new complication occurred. God was working behind the scenes.

Finally, a day came when the baby at least started breathing without stopping which was an encouragement to all the staff. The seizures subsided, jaundice subsided, chest was getting better and finally on day 9 of admission, the baby finally opened his eyes. Slowly started feeding little by little and the rest was nothing but a miracle. He required oxygen support for 13 days but was off it on day 14. The parents were greatly relieved. The baby went home after 15 days of admission feeding well. The happiness that the family experienced could be felt by all of us around.

The baby came back after a month, 2.7kg, doing totally fine. Suggested them to follow up with a developmental pediatrician for further management.
